

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Events

Sheboygan County Residents Only

About the Events

Sheboygan County has established a semi-permanent household hazardous waste collection site as of 2026.

Important note: Never leave hazardous waste at any location. Abandoning hazardous waste, even from households, is a State and Federal offense.

Collection Location & Dates

There will be two to three Veolia workers on sight when you come to drop off your HHW. Collection times will be held two days a week, each for three hours. Please see below for the 2026 schedule:

The events run from May 18th to October 16th

Tuesdays from 9AM-12PM

Thursdays from 1PM-4PM

Schedule Drop-Off Date

You will now need to **sign up in advance** for a drop-off date. To sign up and pay, please go to [SheboyganCountyHHW.com](https://www.sheboygancountywi.gov/HHW). Please note, new to this year **credit cards will be the only acceptable payment**. We cannot accept cash or checks at these events.

2026 Event Fees

- o \$20 per vehicle with household hazardous waste only
- o \$40 per vehicle with small household electronic waste only (6 items or less**)
- o \$40 per vehicle with both household hazardous waste and small household electronic waste (6 items or less**)

**We accept 6 items or less of electronics. If more electronic items are being recycled, additional fees will apply for each increment of six (6). For example, nine (9) items would cost \$80.

Hazardous Waste Materials

What kind of materials will be accepted at the events?

Are there materials that WILL NOT be accepted? YES!

LATEX PAINT, waste oil, radioactive materials (smoke alarms), explosives, PFAs, medical wastes, waste medications, pressurized cylinders, asbestos, large appliances/electronics, and tires will not be accepted.

What can I do with the unacceptable materials?

- [Waste Oil](#) is recycled at many sites in conjunction with community recycling programs. See the Sheboygan County Planning & Conservation website for more information at www.sheboygancounty.com.
- [Latex \(Water-Based\) Paint](#) is not “hazardous.” It can be disposed of with regular garbage once dried. Simply remove the cover to let it dry up, or pour it out in a container and add kitty litter to help it dry.
- [Waste Pharmaceuticals](#) can be recycled in the lobbies of the Sheboygan, Kohler, Sheboygan Falls, Plymouth, and Elkhart Lake City Police Departments. Each department has an anonymous drop box for recycling.

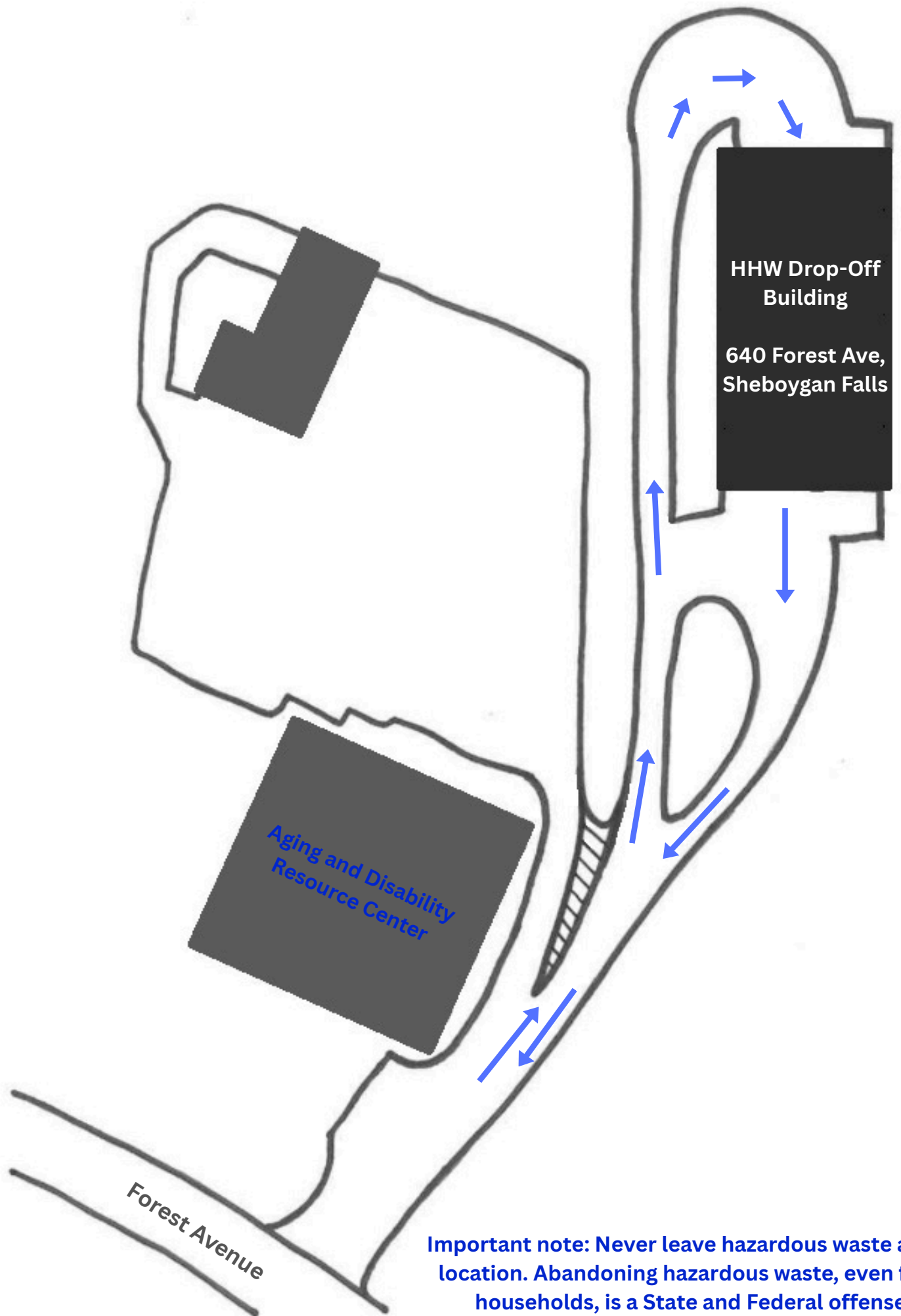
Clean Sweep Collection

This year’s Clean Sweep Collection Events will take place during [all scheduled June dates](#). We encourage citizens to bring their hazardous wastes to these collection events as much as possible because we receive grant money to help pay for these collection events.

During the June Clean Sweep Collection Events, other accepted wastes that will be collected are:

- [Agricultural Hazardous Waste](#) such as pesticides, other chemicals, and pesticide containers. For larger quantities (greater than 250 pounds), there may be an additional cost for Agricultural business wastes.
- [Very Small Quantity Generator Business Hazardous Wastes](#) from small businesses must call Veolia North America to pre-register their waste 1 week prior to the collection date. Contact Zach Davis at (262) 224-3657 for a registration form. There will be a cost for disposing of these items.
